Conservation at Dune Bali

Dune Bali is committed to preserving the natural beauty of Bali through various conservation initiatives. We invite our clients to participate in actions that protect marine and coastal ecosystems.

1. Turtle Release Programs

We protect and release baby sea turtles into the wild, raising awareness about the importance of marine wildlife conservation.

2. Coral Transplantation Workshops

Our clients can participate in coral reef restoration by transplanting healthy corals into damaged areas, thereby promoting a healthy underwater ecosystem.

3. Mangrove Planting

We organize mangrove planting activities to restore coastal ecosystems, prevent erosion, and provide habitats for marine wildlife.


- Marine Ecosystem Conservation: Protecting marine biodiversity through conservation efforts and coral reef restoration.

The Marine Protected Area (MPA) off Bali's southeast coast spans 20,057 hectares and includes Nusa Penida, Nusa Lembongan, and Nusa Ceningan. Home to 296 coral species and 576 reef fish species, it's renowned for its manta ray population.

Established in 2010 by the Klungkung District Government with support from the Coral Triangle Center (CTC), the MPA's management shifted to Bali Province in 2018. The Nusa Penida Management Unit oversees its zoning system and a 20-year management plan.

Dune Penida's active involvement helps preserve the area's biodiversity and natural beauty while supporting global marine conservation efforts.













Dive Adventure Schedule

- **7 am :** Pick up hotel (Kuta, Seminyak, Nusa Dua, Jimbaran, Sanur)
- **7.30 am :** Arrive at our dive center in Sanur to do administration, payment, fitting gear
- 8 am: Departure to dive site (The distance traveled depends on the distance to the dive site. For Penida, we use a speedboat, whereas for Amed, Tulamben, Gili, and Padang Bai, we use a shuttle bus.)
- 9 am: Depart from the dive site
- **10-11 am :** 1st dive
- 12 pm: Lunch break
- 1-2 pm:2nd dive
- 3 pm: Depart to Sanur (The distance traveled depends on the distance from the dive site.)
- 5-6 pm: Arrive in Sanur and drop back hotel

This is just an example and can be modified at any time, based on the conditions.



Important Documents

We recommend using the Dune Connect application to expedite the check-in process on board.

If the **Dune Connect** application is not filled out, you must present the following documents to the cruise manager on board:

DIVE CERTIFICATE

• Your certification provides us with information about your training.

DIVE INSURANCE.

• In the event of an incident, we will be able to assist you best by having your insurance contact and policy number.

MEDICAL STATEMENT

• This is a requirement for individuals older than 45 years. It must be signed by a doctor, allowing you to participate in diving activities. Given that liveaboard dives can sometimes be intense, we want to ensure everything goes smoothly.

LOG BOOK.

• We need to know your diving experience in order to adapt the itinerary and dive planning as effectively as possible.

Missing Diver Procedure:

- · Someone calls EMS while finding out where anyone last saw the missing diver
- Assign spotters to look in that area for bubbles and direct rescuers to the area
- Assign two skin divers to mark the area with buoys
- Try to determine if the missing diver may have left without telling anyone. Have someone looking for the diver's clothes etc.
- Assign qualified divers with scuba equipment and head to the area where the diver was seen last to begin an underwater search.
